Horse judging is a competition in which kids get to experience what it is like to judge riding and halter classes alike. A REAL judge also judges the classes and the kids who are the closest to the judge's placings get the highest points. The older kids do something called "oral reasons," in which they verbally explain the reason they placed a class the way they did to a judge. There a LOTS of materials kids study before they do this, so that they can be as proficient in conformation, equitation and pleasure classes as possible. It is a wonderful learning experience, and a great opportunity for kids to participate in showing, even if they aren't showing a horse.
